WHEREAS, during this nationwide campaign, the City of Medford encourages citizens to help ensure the safety and well-being of their families, neighbors and communities; and

WHEREAS, household preparedness plans, including meeting points, extra emergency supplies and emergency contact lists will help ensure you and your family are prepared for any emergency or disaster; and

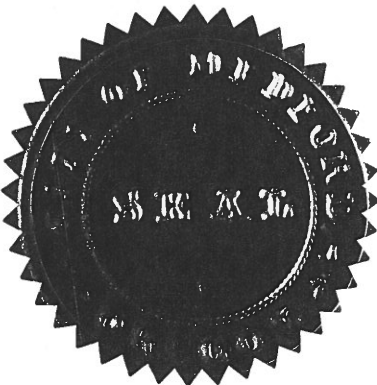
WHEREAS, receiving proper training for emergency situations including: first-aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), the use of automatic external defibrillators (AED) and participating in disaster and emergency training provide the ability to safely and effectively respond to an emergency; and
